My 2009 Awards for Roses are as follows:

-  1<sup>st</sup> in all classes of over 250 growers of Roses in SOUTHPORT SHOW.
-  Best Bloom at YORKSHIRE SHOW
- Won most points in Rose Section in Gardeners Weekend at KINGSHEATH SHOW.
